Workshop Description

This workshop is designed to explore the beautiful and elegant lettering style of Spencerian Script, designed by Platt Roger Spencer in the 1800's. We will explore the gracefulness of nature's forms that inspired Mr. Spencer. The workshop will include study of the lower case, the upper case, and simple off-hand flourishing. This system of writing is still very relevant today. Brides frequently request elegant and graceful Spencerian Script.

Spencerian Script is a pointed pen alphabet built on 4 simple principals and 7 stroke forms. This class is designed for all skill levels. It is most frequently written with an oblique penholder but experience with an oblique penholder is not necessary. If left-handed you may prefer to use a straight penholder. We will also take a look at the differences between Spencerian Script and Copperplate Script so that a better understanding of the elements unique to each form is understood.

Harvest Crittenden has been a professional lettering artist for more than 30 years, specializing in calligraphy, illumination, and engrossing. She has taught at numerous regional, national and international conferences. In 2010 Harvest was inducted as a Master Penman by IAMPETH, one of the oldest lettering arts associations in America.
